

For the past six weeks he had been in the hospital or extended care facilities. Joyce Fish had spoken with him and he was at peace with his eminent passing. Fred was a member of the SBCC for many years until he and his wife, Janet moved to Los Gatos to be near family. Fred was instrumental in bringing the camera club into the digital age and spearheaded efforts to purchase the first laptop computer and digital projector over the objections of some. He was a visionary in that regard and saw the future of photography and the club. His engineering background led him to an early interest in computers and then to the evolving digital photography scene. He enjoyed sharing his knowledge of computers and photography with others. For many years he led DIGSIG, a digital photography/Photoshop group associated with GSBUG (Greater South Bay User's Group). He was a good friend and will be missed.
