JAMES TURRELL INSTALLATION AT POMONA COLLEGE. The Turrell "Skyspace" is outside. We should form carpools and have a restaurant supper and use its restroom.

What is "Dividing the Light" which is shown in the Skyspace? It is an experience in light and color. It is art. It is changing perceptions. The light comes from the sky as it changes before, during and after sunset. The sky in the Skyspace, is a rectangle that is outlined with lights in a steel canopy that change color gradually during the time before and after sunset, over a little more than 1-1/2 hours. Your impressions of depth and the relationship of sky to frame (the colored lights) will change almost imperceptibly. You may set up a tripod and take pictures. It is a public space: we can't know how many others will be present. It could be cool, even cold, since you don't move around much.

Claremont (the location) of the Pomona Museum of Art) can be an hour away, but with pm traffic it could be 1-1/2 hours or more. Car pools should probably meet by 4:00 (3:30?) to allow for supper

The evening program begins about 25 minutes before sunset and continues for about an hour. (From 6pm to 7:35+ pm). You can not bring food to the Skyspace, and there are no restrooms. There are benches to sit on around the periphery. No chairs and a pool in the center. Contact Betsy Treynor for more info.

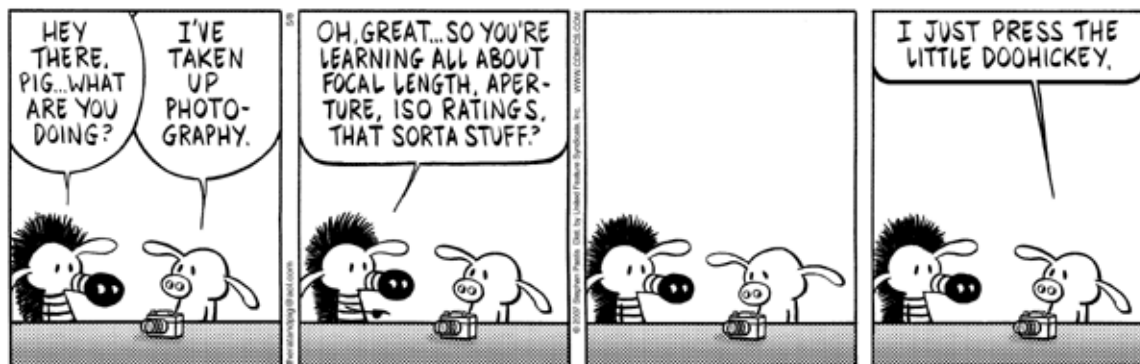
**We are not spending the day nor the night, but you might want to know:
